Safety Corner: More on Child Safety in Amusement Parks

As a parent or guardian, you know outings to amusement and theme parks can be wonderful times, but may also be sources of stress and concern for family members visiting an area with so many new sights and sounds. Plan ahead. Before going to the park, tell your children: To enjoy their outing while paying careful attention to where they are and who they are with at all times. They should not be alone in the park or become isolated with anyone, even characters in costume. Also tell them not to accept any prizes, offers, or gifts from anyone until they have **checked first** with you. Children should also be cautioned not to engage in conversation with or offer assistance to anyone until they have checked with you first. Instruct them to **tell** you if anyone approaches them or makes them feel scared, uncomfortable, or confused. Tell your children if they are approached by anyone who tries to take them away to yell, **“This person is not my father/mother/guardian!”** Make sure your children carry some form of identification and family/emergency contact information with them in case they become lost, become separated or need assistance. Consider dressing your children in or asking them to wear brightly colored clothes so they may be more easily spotted in the park.

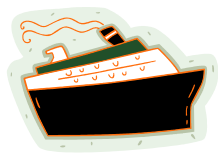
Lost: Two Knitting Books
